PARKING FOR CANADA DAY

Streets in the village are crowded so avoid congestion and use the Event Parking Area north of Bath Public School.

There is limited handicapped parking (with a sticker) on Church St. next to the Fairfield-Gutzeit House.

If appropriate, park in the Church Street lot and use the free shuttle to get down to the action.

FREE SHUTTLE



The free shuttle bus runs from 9:30 to 5:30 making round trips from the Event Parking Area on Church Street to the corner of Church and Main Streets.

With stops at the Fire Hall / St John’s Hall it’s a hop on, hop off, continuous service and a great way to transport walkers, strollers and kids of all ages.

EXPECT TRAFFIC DELAYS

From 9 am to 5 pm traffic coming from Amherstview and points east will be re-routed from Fast Freddy’s down Academy Street to Church Street and then to Main Street. People coming into the Village from the west will reverse the route. Expect traffic to be slow coming through the Village.

The Roads into the Village will close at 12 noon to clear the route for the parade.

To avoid delays during this time please use the following alternate route to get around the Village. From the west: take County Road 8 north to County Rd. 22, then east to County Rd 7. Turn south (towards Bath) then left on Doyle Road to County Road 4.

Reverse if coming from the east.

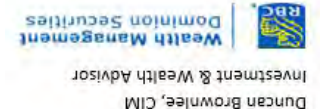
