

BATH ROCKS ON CANADA DAY!

On Canada Day we have music from 10 in the morning right up to the Fireworks!

Buskers take the stage around 10 am in Centennial Park, then move to the corner of Main and Church and beside the tennis/pickleball courts across from St. John's Hall. Slip some change in your pocket to show your appreciation.

CJAI will have a remote broadcasting station in Centennial Park where you can make a request for a favourite song or give a Happy Canada Day shout-out to someone special.

Almost Famous will perform in Centennial Park from 2-4:30pm.

From 8-10 pm the **ToneKats** will play at Bath Public School grounds. Special guests include Bon Evans of Bath and returning from last year, Alexa Goldie.

The winner of the **'Who Will Sing O, Canada?'** contest will perform at the Official Ceremonies in Centennial Park at 2:45 and before the Fireworks.



PARKING FOR CANADA DAY

Streets in Bath are crowded on Canada Day. Follow the signs to the Event Parking Area on Church Street. It offers 4.5 acres of parking and access to the free Shuttle Bus. An area close to the bus stop will be cordoned off for those with mobility problems. The shuttle bus can accommodate fold up walkers and strollers.

The parking area is monitored by the Amherstview and Bath scouts. A donation is appreciated.

There is limited Handicapped Parking on Main Street next to Village Pizza for those with Handicap stickers. This property will be policed.

EMERGENCY ROUTE

Academy Street from Bulch Avenue to Second and Main Street is the emergency route for the village during Bath Canada Day. No parking areas along the route will be policed to ensure that two way access by emergency vehicles is possible.

EXPECT TRAFFIC DELAYS

From 9 am to 12 Noon and 2-5 PM traffic coming from Amherstview and points east will be re-routed from Main street just past Fast Freddy's down Academy Street to Church Street and then to Main Street. People coming into the Village from the west will reverse the route. Expect traffic to be slow coming through the Village.

All Roads into the Village will close at 12 noon to clear the route for the parade.

Parking is available at the event parking area on Church Street if approaching from north of the village. If you are inviting guests for the Parade, they should be in the Village before noon.

For those not wanting to come into Bath between 12 and 2 pm

To avoid delays during this time use the following alternate route to get around the Village.

From the west:

Take County Road 8 (at the hydro plant) north to County Rd. 22, then east to County Rd 7. Turn south (towards Bath) then left on Doyle Road to County Road 4 or turn north to go to highway 2

Reverse if coming from the east.

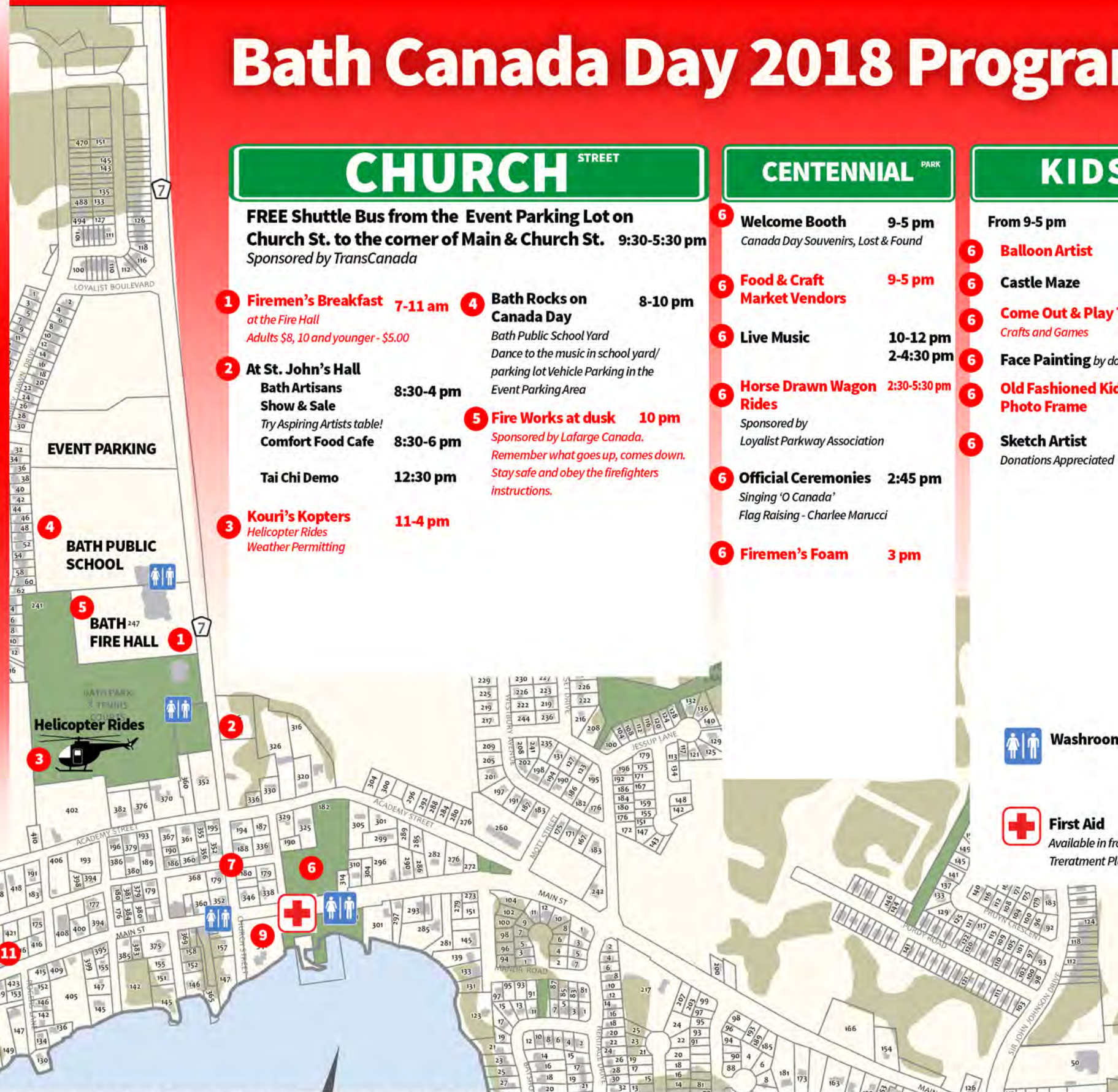
